Thursday Hold-em Poker Tournament

The following conditions are to be read in conjunction with the Casino Canberra Ltd Rules of Poker (Hold-em).

- Game:** POKER – HOLD-EM
- Starting time:** 19:30pm (which may be revised as per below)
- Dates:** Every Thursday, from 22 February 2018 until 27 December 2018
- Entry fee:** \$110 (\$10 for tournament commission, \$100 for tournament prize pool)
- Each player entering the tournament will receive \$5,000 in tournament chips.
- Rebuys:** Nil
- No of Players:** Minimum 10 - maximum of 40 plus Alternate players for the first 4 levels.
- If the minimum number of players have not registered by 19:50 then the starting time for the tournament may be delayed by the Tournament Director/ Assistant up until 20:30.
- The Tournament Director/ Assistant shall announce the revised starting time on or before 19:50hrs.
- If the minimum number of players has not been reached by the time notified as the revised starting time, the tournament shall not proceed.
- Late entries, after the tournament has commenced, will be accepted subject to clause 7 of the general terms and conditions below.

Prize pool breakdown:

The prize pool for a tournament will be distributed as follows:

- the 1st and 2nd place-getters in a tournament will be awarded an entry ticket (to the value of \$220) into the next scheduled monthly \$220 Poker Classic tournament and will be registered for that tournament; and
- the remaining money in the prize pool (after deducting the value of the two entry tickets i.e. \$440) will be awarded to eligible place-getters according to the table below:

Blinds: There shall be two blinds increasing as per schedule below. Each level will be played for thirty minutes.

Then doubling every 30 minutes thereafter with the big blind always double the small blind. No Ante on heads up play.

General terms and Conditions

1. A tournament is open to Infinity members (**members**) only.
2. There shall be no limit to the number of times that players may raise their bets during a round of play.
3. A tournament will conclude when one player remains.
4. A player who has won an entry ticket (and registration) into the next scheduled monthly \$220 Poker Classic tournament may transfer that prize to another member.
5. A member claiming a seat in a monthly \$220 Poker Classic tournament, as a consequence of a transfer, must provide satisfactory evidence of the transfer to the Tournament Director/Assistant, in order to take that seat.

6. If a member (or eligible transferee) does not take their seat in a monthly \$220 Poker Classic tournament, the value of their entry ticket (not including the tournament commission payable for the monthly tournament) will still be included in the prize pool for that monthly \$220 Poker Classic tournament.
7. Late entries and/or alternate players (reserve players who are waiting on a seat to become available through the elimination of player/s or player/s not taking their seat) must be seated prior to the conclusion of the first four levels and are entitled to a full starting stack of tournament chips with a value of \$5,000.
8. Any entry fees (less tournament commission) paid by players in relation to the tournament will go into the prize pool for the tournament and will be allocated according to the prize breakdown described above.
9. All seating positions are at the direction of the Tournament Director/Assistant.
10. The tournament shall be conducted by the Tournament Director/Assistant in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in this document and the approved Rules of Poker Hold-em (Rules) and, in the event of any inconsistency, the Rules shall prevail.
